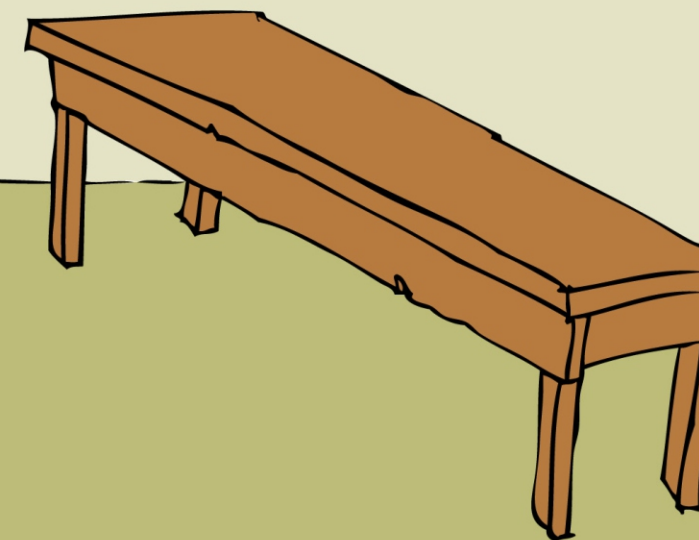
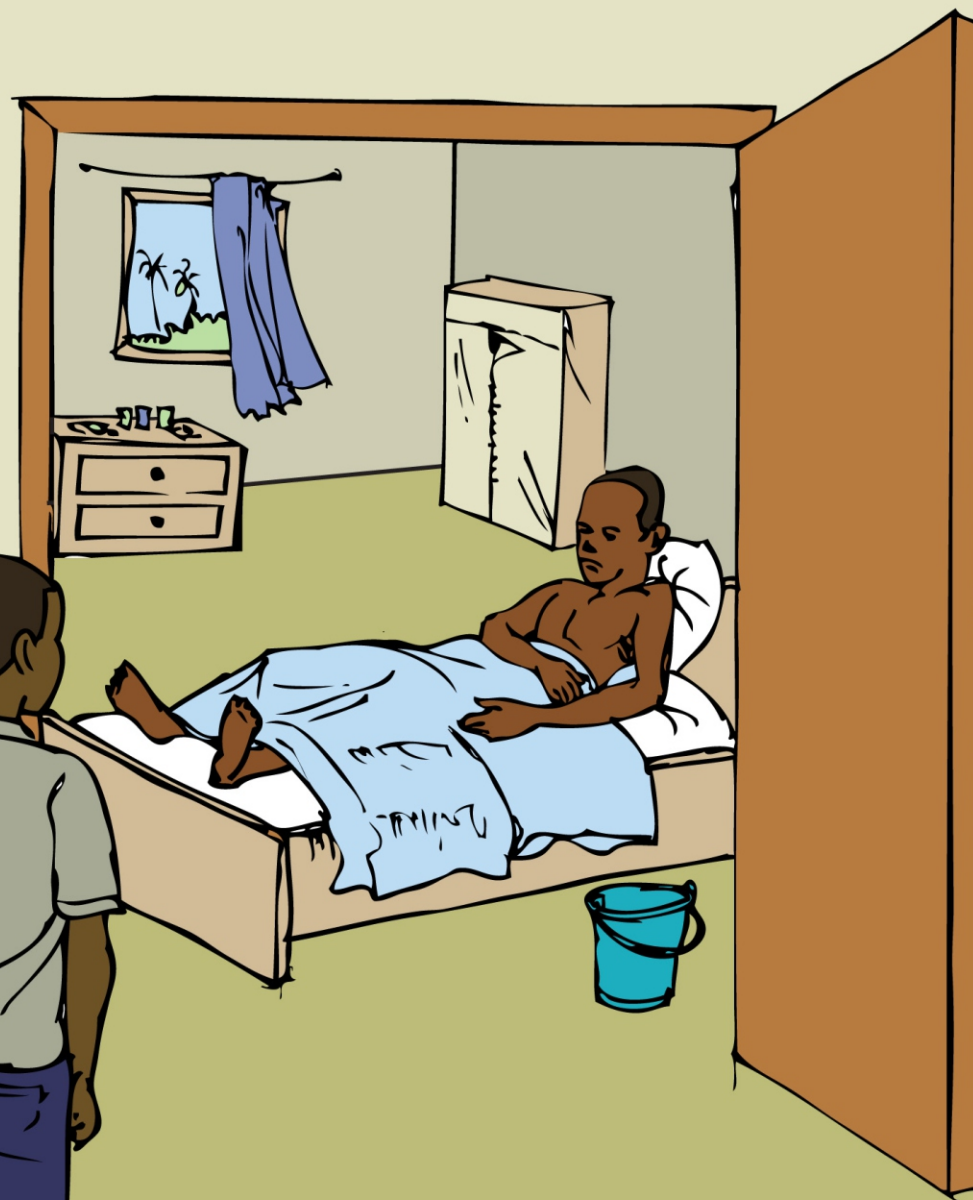

Keep sick family members separate

LISTEN!

- **Questions:**
 - WHAT do you see in the picture?/Who can explain?
 - Has it HAPPENED to you or someone in the community?
 - WHAT are the stories, experiences, fears, "they say" you have heard about what you see in this picture?
- **Remember:**
 - Listen to the stories, fears and rumors about the community's experience.
 - Listen ONLY. Do **NOT** clarify anything here.

LEARN!

- **Question:**
 - WHAT do you do when someone in your family is sick?
 - HOW do you or your family keep safe?
 - Why is it important for us to keep sick family members in their own area?
 - What BAD things could happen if sick family members are not kept in a safe place?
 - WHY should you keep safe?
- **MOH Message:**
 - If someone is sick with Ebola - like symptoms, keep them in their own area.
 - Do not touch them. Call 4455 and tell the community leader.
 - Let them go to the clinic. Early treatment can save them from Ebola.
 - The clinic has trained health workers, medicine, and food.
- **Remember:**
 - Don't talk plenty. Allow the people to talk more.
 - Share information by asking questions.

ACT!

- **Questions:**
 - What will you do?
 - How are you going to do it?
 - Why will you do that?
- **Action:**
 - If someone is sick with Ebola - like symptoms, keep them in their own area.
 - Do not touch them. Call 4455 and tell the community leader.
 - Let them go to the clinic.
- **Remember:**
 - Ensure the community makes a decision to take action.
 - Ask questions to make people make good decisions.
